_____	<b>anoint</b>	<b>A</b>	The way the sacrament is celebrated, including the words, actions, and materials used in the sacrament.
_____	<b>consecrate</b>	<b>B</b>	The one who has the authority and power to confer or give the sacrament.
_____	<b>minister</b>	<b>C</b>	Greek translation of "messiah" or "anointed one."
_____	<b>rite</b>	<b>D</b>	To put oil on someone or something. In salvation history, it is a sign of the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.
_____	<b>Sacred Chrism</b>	<b>E</b>	Hebrew word meaning "anointed one" and the title for the promised savior of God's people.
_____	<b>Christ</b>	<b>F</b>	To set someone or something apart for a special purpose or mission.
_____	<b>Messiah</b>	<b>H</b>	A mixture of olive oil and balsam (a sweet-smelling substance that comes from certain trees) that is blessed by a bishop and used in Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders, and the consecration of a new church.
