Picking up from last week.

After Saint Luke's version of the Beatitudes, Jesus continues his Sermon on the Plain (The Sermon on the Mount in Saint Matthew's telling). "Give to everyone ... Do to others ... Love your enemies ... Be merciful ... Stop judging ... Stop condemning ... Give in good measure." This recalls the Jewish sense of mitzvah—both the doing of the commandments and the doing of acts and deeds beyond duty that connect us to GOD. Christians distill the older list of 613 to the golden rule and the 8 Corporal and 8 Spiritual Works of Mercy.
