FALSE PROPHETS, TRUE PROPHETS

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God's very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God's mouth. In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the authority of God's own voice, the Holy One of God. The whole history of our church is filled with both true and false prophets. But in today's Gospel we learn that Jesus' fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn't an authority because he was popular or famous. We also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God's purposes. And today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God's very words filling our mouths.

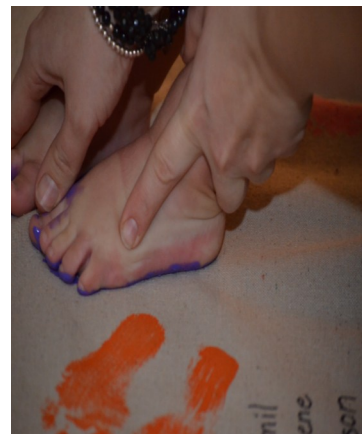

Every month, each of us find a yellow envelope in our monthly envelope package that is labeled: Haiti Parish Twinning Program. It is my hope that I can build an intricate bridge with pictures and stories between us and St. Maximilian Kolbe parish in order to bring us a little closer to the parish we support. St. Maximilian Kolbe's pastor is Rev Fr Fenel Exantus, who has been at the parish since September 2010. The parish is in the arduous process of building a church. It currently has walls, but no roof. Lack of funds stopped the completion of the roof because the materials are expensive. However, it is Rev Fr Fenel's hope that the roof will be funded and completed by August 14th of this year. The School of priestly Pere Antoine Dolan provides education for children from preschool through primary certification. Because the children come from poor families, the parish school must provide meals the children every day. The parish has three chapels: Chapel of Cayon; Lassere's chapel; and Chapel of the Sisters of Charity. There is also a hospice for the dying and a sewing center for the women. Of the monthly twinning's offering collected at St Cecilia's, 94% goes directly to Rev Father Exantus to use to support his parish and parishioners. The remaining 6% helps cover the administrative costs of this most valuable program.
