

	10 Nisan	10 Nisan	A Jewish family would select a sacrificial lamb for their Passover meal.
			They would inspect it until 14 Nisan.

	14 Nisan	Pesauch	They would slaughter the sacrificial lamb and eat a meal with unleavened bread
			& herbs to commemorate the Israelites' deliverance from slavery in Egypt.

Passover	15 Nisan	Hag HaMatzot	They celebrate the unleavened bread, which, made in a hurry without yeast,

٩	17 Nisan	Reishit	They offer the first ripe sheaf (firstfruits) of barley to the Lord
			as an act of dedicating the harvest to him.
			Feast of First Fruits - Lev 23:9-14
	6 Sivan	Shavuot	(50 days after Reishit) They offer the new grain of the summer wheat harvest to
		*	the Lord to show joy and thankfulness for the Lord's blessing of harvest.
