Virtue

A habitual and firm disposition to do the good.

Theological

These virtues come from God and lead to God.

They are conferred at Baptism with sanctifying grace.

They inform & give life to the Cardinal Virtues.

Cardinal

These are <u>moral</u> virtues, acquired by human effort: education, deliberate acts & perseverance in struggle.

They are like habits. They need to be practiced.

They can be lost if they are neglected.

Theological Virtues

Faith We believe in God and all that he has said & revealed to us.

Hope We desire the kingdom of heaven & eternal life as our happiness.

Charity

We love God for His own sake & we love others out of love for God.

Charity is selfless love.



Cardinal Virtues

Cardinal comes from cardo, the Latin word for hinge, meaning "that on which other things depend."



Prudence to judge correctly what is right & what is wrong in any given situation.

wisdom - vs - intellect

Justice the constant & permanent determination to give everyone his or her rightful due.

fairness · vs - will

Fortitude forbearance, strength, endurance, & the ability to confront fear, uncertainty, & intimidation.

courage - vs - fear

Temperance the practice of self-control, abstention, and moderation.

restraint - vs - desires/passions
